National Family Week Photography Competition

Competition Terms and Conditions

1. The competition will run on the website www.nationalfamilyweek.co.uk from 20th May 2010 until midnight BST on 21st June 2010.
2. The competition is open to all residents of the UK though any under 16's will need the consent of a parent or guardian. Employees of Family Week, Tesco Electricals or any of their respective associated companies, their immediate families or any person otherwise connected with the competition shall not be eligible for entry.
3. Entrants must not be professional photographers and, for the purposes of this competition, a professional photographer will be considered to be someone who makes more than half their annual income from the sale of their photographs.
4. Only one entry per household shall be permitted. To qualify for entry, the form on www.nationalfamilyweek.co.uk must be completed in full.
5. In order to qualify, any submitted photograph must be of a minimum of two (2) members of the entrant's family, which may or may not include the entrant themselves. A short caption describing the photograph must also be included. In addition the entrants must be the sole owner of copyright in all photographs entered and must have obtained permission of any people featured in the entries, or their parents/guardians if children under 16 are featured. Further, entrants or the person responsible for taking the photograph must not have breached any laws when taking their photographs.
6. Prior to submission, entrants must not have offered any of their entries for sale, been paid for any publication of any of their entries, or won or been a runner-up in any other photographic competition with any of their entries.
7. The winner will be the entrant whose photograph in the opinion of National Family Week Ltd is the most appropriate for use as the official photograph of National Family Week 2011.
8. A judging panel comprising Family Week staff shall review all entries and select a short-list of approximately 12 photographs based on the criteria above. The winner shall be the short-listed entrant whose photograph in the opinion of Family Week most closely delivers on the above criteria.
9. The winner agrees to grant to Family Week a royalty free, worldwide, irrevocable and perpetual license to feature the winning photograph exclusively as the official family photograph for National Family Week 2010. Such licence shall extend to the publications of Family Week, to its websites and to all of its promotional material or for any other purpose as is deemed reasonable by Family Week. No fee shall be payable for any of these uses and no further permission shall be required from the winner. While every effort to credit the winner will be made, Family Week cannot guarantee that use of the winning photograph(s) will include the photographer's name.
10. The winner will be selected within fourteen (14) days of the closing date and will be notified by phone and email within twenty-eight (28) days from selection. Family Week shall make every reasonable endeavour to contact the winner within this time. Should the winner be uncontactable or is otherwise unable to take up the prize, Family Week reserves the right to award the prize to a reserve runner up selected at the same time as the original and using the same criteria from the remaining qualifying entries.
11. There is one prize worth £1,000 consisting of photography equipment from Tesco Electricals. Full prize terms and conditions are outlined below.
12. The winning entrant shall receive their photography equipment within twenty-eight (28) days of their notification by Family Week.

Standard Terms & Conditions of Competition Entry

1. These terms and conditions together with any specific rules set out in Competition Notices (as defined below) are the Competition Rules ("Rules") and apply to any competition ("Competition") promoted by Family Week Limited ("Family Week").
2. Rules specific to each Competition are displayed on the page for such Competition ("Competition Notice") or in a notice in which the Competition appeared and are incorporated into the Rules. In the event of discrepancy between these terms and conditions and the Competition Notices, the Competition Notice shall prevail.
3. Family Week reserves the right to cancel or amend the Competition or the Rules without notice in the event of a catastrophe, war, civil or military disturbance, act of God or any actual or anticipated breach of any applicable law or regulation or any other event outside Family Week's reasonable control. 4. In the event of any dispute regarding the Rules, conduct, results and all other matters relating to a Competition, the decision of Family Week and/or the judge(s) shall be final and no correspondence or discussion shall be entered into.
5. Entrants must be resident in the United Kingdom and/or the Isle of Man. The contact details provided with the Competition entry ("Entry") will be used to inform of any prizes. It is solely the responsibility of the entrant to ensure that all the contact details they supply are current and correct.
6. Employees of Family Week or any associated company of Family Week and their immediate families or any sponsors or persons otherwise connected with the Competition and their immediate families are not eligible to enter the competition.
7. Additional eligibility requirements, including but not limited to a valid passport, visa, a driver's licence and/or insurances, may apply on a Competition-by-Competition basis.
8. By entering any competition, an entrant warrants that all information they submit is true, current and complete. Family Week reserves the right to verify the eligibility of all entrants.
9. There is no purchase requirement to enter any Competition. There is no charge to register with a website, if registration is required as part of the entry process.
10. Any unsuitable or inappropriate content submitted as part of an Entry will not be considered eligible for entry and will be deleted without further notice to the entrant.
11. Incomplete Entries or those not received before the closing deadline shall be disqualified. Family Week shall not accept responsibility for Entries lost through technical fault, transmission delays or postal errors. Proof of submission or postage shall not be deemed automatic proof of receipt.
12. Winners may be required to take part in promotional publicity relating to the competition for which reasonable notice and expenses shall be provided. Family Week reserves the right to use the names of the winners in any publicity both in print and online.
13. In the event of exceptional circumstances beyond its reasonable control, Family Week reserves the right to offer an alternative prize of an equal or greater value.
14. Prizes are non-transferable and cannot be substituted for a cash alternative unless otherwise stipulated. Specific terms and conditions of prizes also apply.
15. Winners will be chosen at random, unless specified otherwise in the Competition Notice, from all qualifying Entries within twenty-eight (28) days of the closing deadline specified in the Competition Notice. In all matters, the decision of the judge(s) shall be final and binding and no correspondence will be entered into.
16. Winners will be notified by phone and email within twenty-eight (28) days (unless otherwise specified) from selection. Family Week shall make every reasonable endeavour to contact the winner within this time. Should the winner be uncontactable or is otherwise unable to take up the prize, Family Week reserves the right to award the prize to a reserve runner up selected at the same time as the original and using the same criteria from the remaining qualifying entries.
17. Where a prize may not be appropriate for a younger contestant, the minimum age for entry will be stated in the Competition Notice and must be observed. Family Week reserves the right to request written proof of age of any winner.
18. All taxes, insurances, transfers, spending money and other expenses as the case may be, unless specifically stated in the Competition Notice, are the sole responsibility of the prize winner.
19. Family Week does not, unless agreed with the entrant, claim any rights of ownership in the Entry. As such, the entrant retains ownership and copyright, although Family Week will be able to use Entries in the manner set out in the Rules.

Any information collected by Family Week in relation to this promotion is done so under the guidelines of the Data Protection Act and all information is held in accordance with the principles laid down by the Act.
